Swan Valley **Communities** That Care

Approximately three years ago, the Swan Valley was one of three pilot communities selected to take part in the "Communities That Care Program" which provides support from mobilization to evaluation and community planning. Under the direction of a co-ordinator and a volunteer board of directors, they have partnered with a number of local groups and organizations, including the RCMP and school officials, to address concerns such as alcohol and drug abuse, delinquency, teen pregnancy, school drop-outs, depression, and suicide. Their aim is to reward positive behaviour and to ensure young people that they are valued and have a voice. To ensure a visible presence in the area, they have initiated fun activities such as the Halloween Spooktober-Fest, and in December the very successful Swan Valley Toys 4 U drive. To date. feedback on their initiatives has been very positive and the Community Foundation of Swan Valley is pleased to be a part of their efforts to make this valley a better place to live, to work, and to raise a family.

FOUNDATION SUPPORTS HEALTH PROGRAM

In today's hectic, fast-paced, stressful world, some residents may need assistance to see them through the rough times. To address this need for support groups, the Community Foundation has provided a grant to The Health Awareness Program that promotes a healthier lifestyle, and the tools with which to achieve it. It's designed to deal with three separate issues: depression recovery, smoking cessation, and weight loss. Each initiative will be conducted by a group of well trained volunteers, with monthly follow-up sessions. The grant money will be used towards training and advertising expenses, plus the purchase of text books and other related materials. Although made possible through the Health Awareness Department of the Swan River Seventh-day Adventist Church, it is essentially a non-religious support program open to all residents. The Foundation is pleased to help make these programs available to residents of the valley.

All gifts are pooled and invested in permanent endowment funds, which generate interest used to support community projects in a broad variety of charitable areas.

In conjunction with the projector the Foundation helped fund in 2013, presentations for educational programs on aging can now be viewed at staff meetings, seminars, out in the community, and by the volunteer board members. Service to Seniors plays an important role in this rural community by offering a number of things such as the Lifeline Program, nutritious congregate meals, assistance with referrals to other agencies, transportation to medical appointments for a nominal fee, foot care in the home, blood pressure clinics, finding reliable people to help with odd jobs for a reasonable price, as well as social activities, entertainment, and a library outreach program. With today's aging community, the Foundation is pleased to be a part of this much-needed program.



With financial support from the Community Foundation of Swan Valley, new automated doors have been installed at the ACL Resource Centre in Swan River. The Centre not only houses the administrative offices of the Association of Community Living, but the workshop where papers for the Lions Club Recycling program are sorted and a rag-cutting operation is carried out. It is also used for meetings by the Special Olympics and the Crisis Centre, as well as training programs, entertainment, and other activities. The new doors put an end to long-standing safety and health concerns and ensure that the building is fully accessible by participants who have mobility issues. The Foundation is pleased to have been a part of this much-needed project that brings the building up to today's standards.


