Children's Area Expanded

Many Valley youth are fascinated with the new “learning wall” recently installed at the NW Regional Library, where young families are encouraged to meet with other parents. The library offers a fun, comfortable, safe place for pre-schoolers to interact with other children. There is a story time program for four-year-olds, while younger children can enjoy the new activity centre, play games, and look at books. The Community Foundation is pleased to have helped fund this new activity wall that continues to support their mandate to promote learning at an early age.

New Tables for Swan River Adult Education

With a grant received from the Community Foundation of Swan Valley in December 2016, Swan River Adult Education Inc. has purchased two new tables for the classroom area. The primary mission of Swan River Adult Education is to provide a comfortable, friendly, and safe learning environment. With the addition of the new tables, it is hoped that many adult learners will continue to access the program and ultimately enrich their lives.

Wellman Lake Facility Offers a Wonderful Camping Experience

The Church Camp at Wellman Lake has offered generations of valley residents the opportunity to enjoy the camping experience. Designed for youngsters between the ages of five and fifteen, they have the chance to enjoy the joys of nature, good food, boating and water safety, wilderness training, first aid, and most importantly, the gift of making new friends. Youth volunteers learn about leadership as a counsellor-in-training. In June there was a flurry of activity at the camp that included a general cleanup, replacing a much-needed roof, and installing a new set of doors. The camp is used by several community organizations for various events. It is the local four-season lodge that can accommodate large groups, The Community Foundation is pleased to have supported this youth oriented program.

Swan River Junior Curling

With help from the Community Foundation, the S.R. Junior Curling Club has purchased six cameras and TV screens so spectators can clearly see the house at the other end of the rink. Not only does this help to promote interest in curling for the valley's youngsters, the equipment will be used by other clubs for their special events. The Foundation is pleased to support this program for the young curlers.

REPORT FROM THE BOARD

I am pleased to report that the Community Foundation of Swan Valley has once again experienced much success in this our 12th year. Since our beginnings in 2005, the people of and those with connection to the Swan River Valley have demonstrated that philanthropy is indeed alive and well. This past year was one of both change and growth. The change occurred when in April of this year, after 8 years as a member of the CFSV Board of Directors and a number of years as Executive Director, Vivian Rooks decided to step back from the Foundation's daily operations. We thank Vivian for her many years of dedication and service to the Community Foundation of Swan Valley. Vivian will continue to volunteer with the Granting Committee of the Foundation. In April we also welcomed Donna Martin as our new Executive Director. Donna brings a great deal of expertise, enthusiasm, and passion to her new role and we look forward to working with Donna for many years to come. Donna is always ready to answer any questions you may have about your Community Foundation. The CFSV has also experienced growth. During the past fiscal year, the Foundation has received in excess of \$64,000 in new contributions and has now reached \$1.71 million in contributions since 2005. And over the past year, the market value of the Foundation has increased by just over \$175,000 and at year's end stood at almost \$2.2 million. The Foundation has experienced an 11.86% average rate of return on its investments over the past 5 years. The best news of all is that the Community Foundation was able to distribute \$75,118 in grants and scholarships during the year, bringing our 12 year total giving to \$397,399. Thank you to everyone that has contributed to the CFSV, whether with financial contributions or with your volunteer time and energy. The work of the CFSV is something we can all be excited about.
