REPORT FROM THE BOARD

Philanthropy has a rich history in our province. CFSV is one of 57 established Community Foundations in Manitoba with over two thirds supporting small communities like ours and is home to the Winnipeg Foundation. The Winnipeg Foundation was the first Community Foundation of its kind in Canada, celebrating 100 years in 2021. Leading by example, The Winnipeg Foundation has taught us to be innovative, collaborative and demonstrated that all donations regardless of size have the power to make a positive impact on our local communities.

Reflecting on this past year, CFSV embraced unprecedented change and growth. Celebrating over one million dollars in total giving since we were established in 2005, we received just over \$490,000 in new donations and saw the creation of 8 new funds in this past fiscal year.

CFSV has been insulated from some of the volatility of the current market conditions through our partnership with the Winnipeg Foundation and our combined funds sit currently at a respectable \$3,925,000 dollars in market value at our June 30 yearend.

Achieving one million in total giving opened the door for CFSV to rebrand ourselves with a new look and logo and an updated website. We moved locations, saying goodbye to the hospitality of Harley House and joined with the Chamber of Commerce in sharing the tourism building.

We embraced the opportunity to gather in person once again celebrating the granting of \$65,000 in new grants back into the community and the awarding of \$38,000 in scholarships to the graduating class of 2022.

In addition, we welcomed Amy Hofford as Executive Assistant to both Donna Martin, our Executive Director, and the CFSV Board of Directors.

As we look towards the new year, I am excited for the momentum that we have achieved, with great respect for the dedicated group of past and present volunteers that make up our board. It has been a privilege to participate in the insightful and collaborative conversations that shape the policies and initiatives

that determine how CFSV funds are distributed back into our community.

As I take my leave of the board at the end of this year, I continue to be inspired by the power of philanthropy. The role CFSV will play in the sustainability and vitality of our communities in the years to come is exciting and I encourage the Swan Valley and surrounding areas to get to know us better!

HOW WE ARE GROWING

Established in 2005 with a fund of \$112,666, a total of \$1,400 was gifted back to our community in that first year. Eighteen years later the endowment fund has grown to \$3.5 million.

CFSV offered two granting opportunities to the community, one in the fall of 2021 and then in the spring of 2022. In total, the fund was able to meet the needs of 19 nonprofit or charity organizations looking for support to expand programming, purchase equipment, assist in education, issue scholarships and awards or rejuvenate infrastructure. A total of \$62,388 was granted.

A FOCUS ON EDUCATION

aving been a school bus driver for the past 45 years, Matt Black has been both a supporter and an advocate for Valley children since early in his career. Through his daily route, as well as his many in-town and out-of-town field trips, there aren't many Swan Valley School Division children that he doesn't get the opportunity to meet at some point during their schooling. One of his many ways of giving back to the youth of our community is through two educational bursaries that are awarded each year during the Swan Valley Regional Secondary School graduation exercises.

For many years, Matt and his late wife Monica would provide the funds for their bursary out of pocket. But, in December 2018 Matt created his first fund with the CFSV following that with a second fund in December 2020.

The Monica Black Memorial Bursary serves to help Monica's legacy live on. She was employed by the local hospital for more than 30 years and was the first employee to serve on the former Parkland Regional Health Authority board. Healthcare was important to her so it only made sense that, when promoting higher education through a bursary in her memory, it would be awarded to a female student entering their first year

of university or college, with a focus on health sciences.

The Matt Black and Shannon
Gauthier Education Bursary, which
Matt established with his current
partner, can be applied to students
entering Culinary Arts, Early Childhood
Education or Graphic Design. But,
more importantly, it can be used when
there is a student who needs the funds
but doesn't fit in another category.

Matt's funds creates enough interest on his investment to pay for the bursary each year and he takes pride in the fact that this will be ongoing, far into the future, and will give back for generations to come.

LEAVING A LASTING LEGACY

Anyone lucky enough to have met Angela Hinchliffe knew she had a fundamental impact on people. She was a community builder, role model, mentor, entertainer, political sparring partner, fashionista and general supporter to those who needed a friend. And she deeply loved this community that she and her husband Doug made their home.

Angela was born on May 22, 1938. She and her family lived in the small maritime mining town of Springhill, Nova Scotia.

After graduating from Acadia University in 1958, Angela worked for the Halifax Children's Aid Society. She met her husband Douglas Hinchliffe, an officer with the Royal Canadian Navy; they married in 1959 and had two children.

The family was posted to Victoria, British Columbia for four years before leaving military life in 1968 and settling in Swan River. Once here, she started working for The Star and Times, becoming the first female editor. She met the challenges of her position with an objective eye for reporting, while standing her ground and using her

fiery personality, sharp intelligence and wonderful sense of humour.

As a voracious reader, Angela was a dedicated worker in expanding and improving the town's library. She sat on the board, wrote and applied for grants to generate funds, and always had a stack of library books which she seemed to read simultaneously.

Angela continued this type of work as the CFSV came to fruition and flourish. In the early stages, she provided administrative support and her volunteer work continued until her health no longer allowed it.

Angela courageously faced a diagnosis of terminal cancer with her loved ones at her side, passing away in February of this year.

As Doug was a founding member,



choosing the CFSV to keep both of their legacies alive has been an easy one for the Hinchliffe's. The Doug & Angela Hinchliffe donor-advised fund will continue to give back for decades to come, just as Angela did in life.
