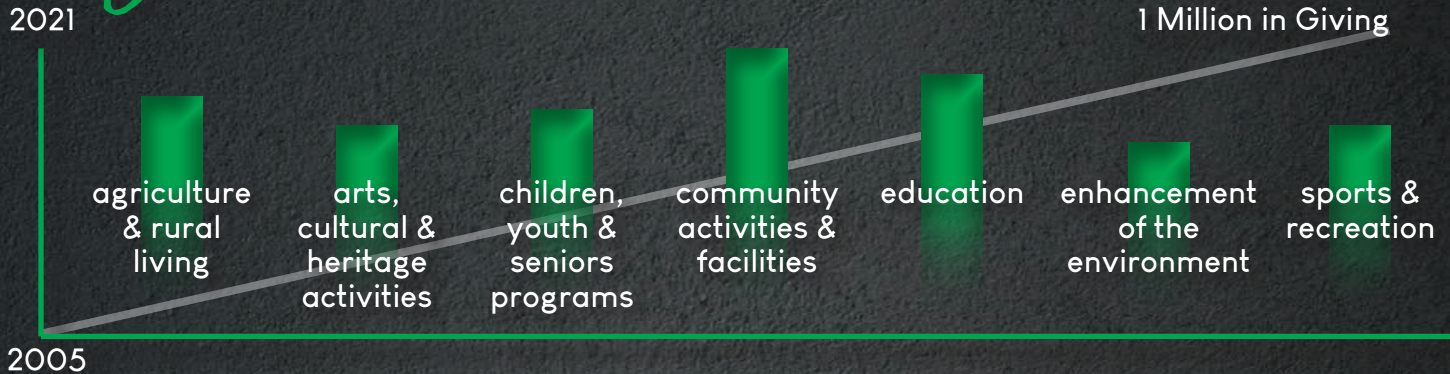
In 2021, CFSV celebrated a record breaking \$1 Million dollars in total giving. Looking back to 2005/2006 and our first year of granting, we proudly donated \$1,610.46 to a total of 9 community organizations.

Fast forward to 2020/2021, CFSV offered two granting opportunities to the community, one in the fall of 2020 and then in the spring of 2021. In total the foundation was able to meet the needs of 20 non-profit or charity organizations looking for support to expand programming, purchase equipment, assist with education, issue scholarships & awards or rejuvenate infrastructure. A total of \$83,204 was granted.

Philanthropy dates back to Greek society. The famous philosopher Plato in 347 B.C., for example, in his will instructed his nephew to use the proceeds of the family farm to fund the academy that Plato founded. The money helped students and faculty keep the academy running. Plato's philanthropic spirit has endured and still exists today in the Swan River Valley.

This year has again been a very successful year for the Community Foundation of Swan Valley. The pandemic did not allow us to conduct our annual granting evenings in a manner that allowed us to gather but we were able to disperse our funds to successful recipients by arranging one on one meetings. This past year local Municipalities declared Feb 21-27, Foundation Awareness Week in the Valley. The foundation partnered with the Swan Valley Co-Op for this event. Our plan is to annually conduct Foundation Awareness Week in the Valley during this time. We hope to be able to have more businesses participate in the future.

The Foundation continues to grow with a book value of \$2,989,050 as of June 30, 2021, and a corresponding market value of \$3,969,040. This is thanks to the generosity of current, as well as former residents of the valley. Nine new funds were created this year.



These funds were started by individuals and businesses for a variety of reasons; to honour a loved one, support local initiatives and leave a legacy through one's estate. If you are interested in starting your own fund, please talk to one of our board members or our Executive Director.

The pandemic curtailed fundraising for many organizations across the province. In order to support these groups, the provincial government made money available through the Manitoba Bridge Grant. This program was of great benefit to the foundation as our annual Gala was cancelled last November.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all board members and our executive director for their hard work and dedication this past year and also take a moment to thank our retiring board members, Lorne, Max and David for their service to the Foundation board. Your dedication and expertise will be missed.

Thank you, donors, for your continued support of the Community Foundation of Swan Valley. Your generosity is appreciated and valued. Confucius tells us that, a person of humanity is one who, desiring attainment for himself, helps others to attain. That spirit is alive and well in the Valley.

# Joel & Amara Campbell Funds

Legacy by definition speaks to the gifting or endowment of funds to a specific purpose. Quite often this gift or fund is a reflection of an individual's years of experiences and opportunities, their interests and desire to give back or pay it forward for the next generation in their community.

Legacy can also speak to the conscious effort to build on the impact that an individual has had on or in our community. A way to continue to support their passions and develop resources for community members that will not only benefit from the gift but have personal understanding of where it came from and why it is so important. For the community it is a tangible way for us to honour and remember the lives and spirits of those gone from our community family far too soon.

Born 2 years apart, there would be little else that would separate Joel and Amara as siblings. Sharing many of the same loves including skating, hockey, animals and outdoor activities; both would know the loyalty and support of a dedicated friend group and have the hearts of a large extended family.

In 2019 Amara was diagnosed with osteogenic sarcoma (bone cancer). Her incredibly courageous battle against this childhood cancer would give flight to Amara's Amigos, an ambassadorship with CancerCare Manitoba Foundation and the Swan Valley's embrace of Winnipeg Jet's Blake Wheeler's annual "Ride Inside" for cancer drive.

Standing by her side during this challenging time, Joel was a constant source of encouragement and support to Amara. Balancing his commitment to Amara, while still pursuing his love of all sports, successfully managing his academic studies and finding time for friends and family, speaks volumes to the quiet and mature young man Joel was becoming.



In 2020 Blair & Lee-Anne Campbell would know the loss of both of their children. Joel unexpectedly in a tragic accident and Amara to a persistent and difficult to treat cancer. I am not sure it is possible to understand and process how deeply this loss has impacted a well beloved family and our community. Each of us are striving to find ways to honor Joel and Amara and most importantly keep their memories and spirit alive. Not just for those that knew and loved them best, but for the next generation that will get to know their story.

Although Joel and Amara are not with us today, their legacy in our community is just beginning.

The first ever award for the Joel Campbell Memorial Award was gifted to Rebecca Bryn Zamzow for \$1,500 and Presley Sagert was the recipient for the first award of the Amara Campbell Memorial Award in the amount of \$1,000.





# Power of Philanthropy

This past fall, CFSV proudly took the step of awarding the largest single grant to an organization in our 15 year history. \$100,000 was awarded to the Thunderhill Ski Club this spring and will be distributed over a 5 year period. This grant is in support of the development of the new Ski Hill Chalet and trails network development.

As our fund continues to grow, we look forward to supporting the projects that help our community flourish and contribute to the economic development of our valley.

- Celebrate MB 150 Club:** An opportunity to provide a lasting legacy and celebrate Manitoba's 150 Birthday by making a donation of \$1,000 or more between January 1st, 2020 and December 31st 2021.

### FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

## Recognizing we are all a part of something greater

A lot happens in a century. People are born, live and pass away. Time sees societal changes which influence the way we view the world and each other, what we believe and what we do in our lives. People often focus on their personal here and now, but something interesting happens when we examine the world from a 30,000 foot view: we see the bigger picture and we recognize that we are part of something greater, something substantial.

Because of the generosity of Winnipeggers and Manitobans, The Winnipeg Foundation has now been bringing stability and foresight to its work for 100 years. The Foundation was created by William Forbes Alloway in 1921 with a gift of \$100,000. The Foundation's second gift – three gold coins, valued at \$15 – was not received until 1924. This gift was well worth the wait; it demonstrated that it is not the amount, but rather the act of giving that matters, and it solidified that we achieve more when we work together.

Since then, thousands of citizens have made gifts to The Foundation, demonstrating their support for our vision of creating "A Winnipeg where community life flourishes for all." Those generous gifts have resulted in a sizeable endowment, valued at \$1.4 billion as of our 2020 fiscal year-end.

While in 1922, the total amount granted was \$6,000 to six agencies, in 2020 The Winnipeg Foundation distributed \$73 million to approximately 1,000 charities. Those first six grants, however, set the tone for The Foundation's future work by addressing inequities and supporting those experiencing vulnerable situations. Today, The Foundation's activity and mandate remain firmly focused on social justice, human rights and the general vitality and well-being of our community.

In creating Canada's first community foundation, William Forbes Alloway and his wife Elizabeth, the first Legacy donor, established an institution that takes the long view, making a significant impact on our city and province while providing reliable and responsive community support. With this publication, we bring you a snapshot of The Foundation's work decade-by-decade. By explaining what was happening in Winnipeg and beyond each decade, we aim to bring greater context to The Foundation's activities and decisions. As society's needs and interests change, The Foundation has consistently demonstrated its ability to adapt. The latest example of this is The Foundation's support in the face of COVID-19; between March and July 2020, The Foundation distributed \$12.8 million in COVID-19-related grants to the community.

While we don't know what the community will become in the next 100 years, we can feel confident we have built a strong and stable institution that can continue to support its changing needs and emerging opportunities.
